- Discussions will be moved forward and input will be managed appropriately.

- People will be encouraged to take on appropriate tasks and be held accountable towards meeting the necessary goals.
- Committee will deal with specific technical issues regarding the lake and not get bogged down in process. There needs to be tangible outcomes with physical results for the lake that continue to motivate people to take action (e.g. bringing the water level up.)
