2. Steve Quon with SF Police – Taraval Station

- 12 sergeants; 4 lieutenants; 1 captain Taraval station
- One car for Stonestown, SF Zoo, Sloat Center, Lake Merced, etc. (large area)
- Captain Paul Chignell and Sergeant Steve Quon – Lake Merced community rep
- Taraval is 1 of 10 police stations; 116 people serving 160,000 people
- Programs – daily e-mail of every crime/arrest (2000 people subscribe)
- Abandon vehicle program – e-mail and it will be towed the next day
- Ambassador program – if victim of rape, assault, robbery and/or other similar crimes, you will be contacted within 48-72 hours for support
- Vandalism at Boathouse and theft – Recommended to call in any and all crimes/suspicious events – ASK/COMMUNICATE to Taraval station (deficiencies)
- One response was to have officers walk perimeter of LM
- Police agreed to complete a security survey for LMTF

- Resolution #3 - Vote: Yes (5); No (12); Abstained (4)

- Convening a rules committee is recommended to see if MOU has been changed

- Motion to approve (Suzanne) Second
- Discussion – question the scope of study – is it available (a publicly available document)
- PUC wrote RFP – a review panel evaluated proposals
- Request to maintain transparency throughout
- Biotechnical solutions and erosion is it connected to flood control. There was intention to separate Daly City flood control study with Watershed plan. This is in addition to the existing integration components of the two plans.
- David Dawdy with 57 years of experience would like to see more use of existing resources within the LMTF and input from LMTF members
- Unanimous passed

- Friendly amendment to remove any reference to spending specificity from resolution

- No 2; passed - MOU and \$35 new membership fee

## F. SFPUC

### 1. Status of Lake Merced

- Greg Bartow – representative
- Projected that water will stay close to 6.5, but target of 8.5
- Adopted resolution to enter MOU to explore tertiary water plan (2.7 million gallons/day).
- New technologies will expand production within same footprint and will explore feasibility with City of Daly City (can double in production) 4/14 meeting will be final approval
- David Dawdy stated that the increase in the Lake Merced is contradictory to the SFPUC and request a survey of why increase is happening
- Want to know status of SFRPD and SFPUC management relationship?
  - Both agencies are still exploring modification to allow PUC (focus on gap of facility management and land use) taking along as they are affected by budget

- Consulted with Audubon Society and SFRPD and LMTF to address all environmental conditions and satisfaction
- Installation in mid to late August – will update and possibly present model and pilot result at July meeting also did engineering work

- Tier 2 and 3 expansion but defined it as 600 acre boundary (includes road boundary of Lake Merced + Girl Scout property)
